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### **RESEARCH INTERESTS**

Professor Ramlogan's research explores frameworks of resistance and emancipation in cinematic narratives, with particular attention to comparative analysis and the amplification of marginalized voices in global cinema. His work bridges critical theory and creative practice, examining how cinematic form articulates experiences of identity, displacement, and cultural memory across the Caribbean and its diaspora. His scholarship draws on interdisciplinary methodologies from film studies, performance studies, and digital storytelling.

### **TEACHING INTERESTS**

Professor Ramlogan's teaching focuses on film studies and critical analysis, animation history and theory, and visual media literacy at the undergraduate level. His courses emphasize humanities approaches to moving image culture, integrating rigorous analytical methods with innovative pedagogical practices. He also teaches 3D modeling and animation using Autodesk Maya, combining technical skill development with conceptual understanding.
